INTRODUCTION

BIBLICAL LESSON

Shame presents itself in two ways. Sin brings about shame, and people can bring humiliation upon each other through hurtful actions. Jesus died to save us from both causes of shame. This lesson, the first of a two part lesson, teaches us that although sin is a reproach to any people. Sin carries with it a loss of self that is felt. Jesus came to take away our sins and the very grief of sin as well. Jesus is the answer to shame, when we obey Him.
